Community Center Spotlight

JESSIE FAUSKE - Early in the 1920's, Jessie's parents, Cecilia Mae and Peter Jule Fauske, moved from North Dakota with 3 children, Robert, Luella and Elmer, with high hopes of finding a better life in Montana. They settled on a 5 acre plot north of Whitefish, now known as Wisconsin Avenue. Jessie Mary was born on July 27th, 1926, and eight years later her brother Peter LeRoy was born.



Attending the first two grades at the old Lakeside School, Jessie later attended the junior high and high school at Central School in Whitefish. After graduating she went to work at the Whitefish Credit Union. When natural gas came to the valley, Jessie opened the first office for the Montana Power Company in Whitefish. She was then promoted to the Kalispell office, and later the office in Missoula as head of billing accounts. Jessie retired from Montana Power after 26 years.

Jessie married and became the mother of two boys, Jim and Dorne, and two girls, Connie and Laura. During the years of raising a family, Jessie learned how to can, cook and sew through the Pollyanna Club, which she thoroughly enjoyed. Jessie's son Dorne passed away from cancer in 1992. She is also the proud Grandmother of 14 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren.

Jessie has spent the winter in the warm climate in Big River, CA, for the past 25 years, teaching line dancing which has kept her fit and trim. Jessie enjoys spending her summer months in Whitefish with her family and many friends. Jessie volunteers at the WCC, helping in the kitchen and with any mailing that needs to be done.

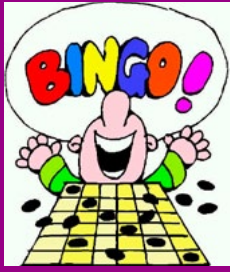
